*From the above you will notice that the events of Holy Week are read in the previous weeks. This is unavoidable if you want to break down the Gospel in reasonable portions to be read each day. The events of Holy Week in the Gospels sometimes take up as much as a half of the length of the Gospel. In Mark, Holy Week starts from Chapter 11.*
